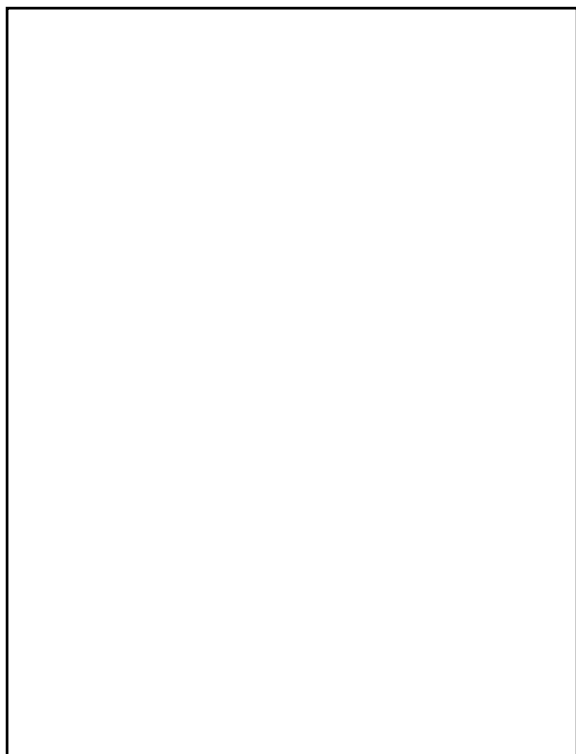


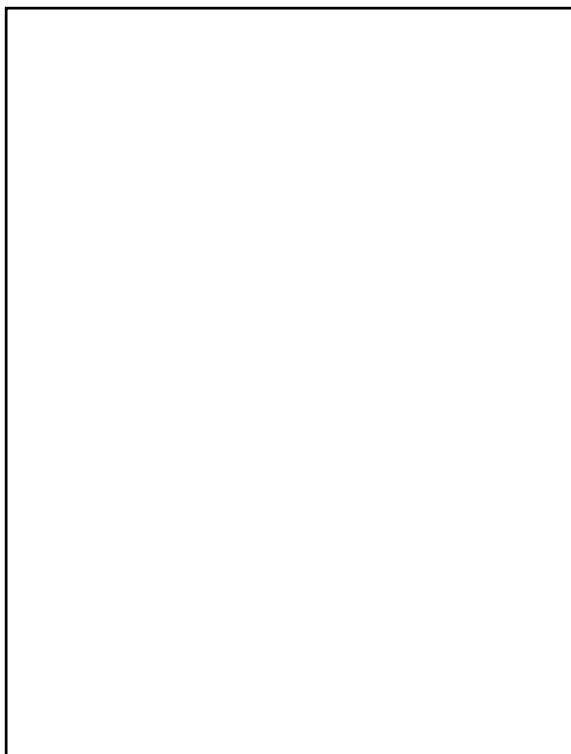

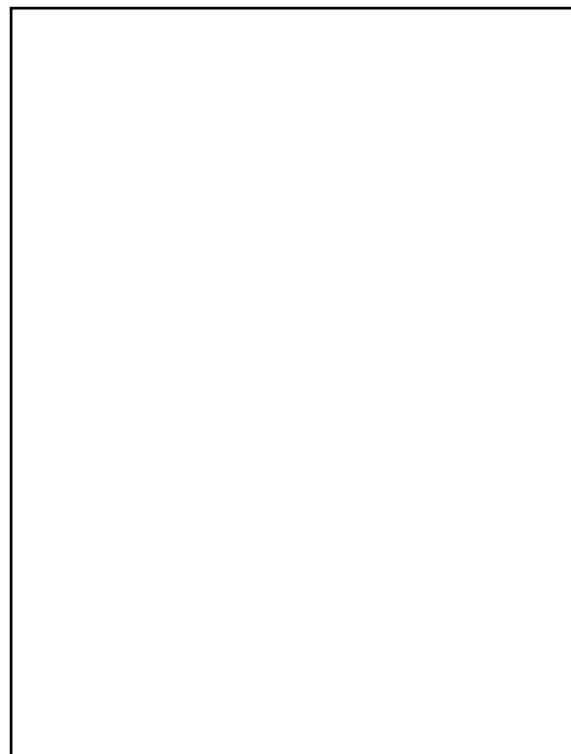
1. Draw an image to represent each version of "All Summer in a Day." Pick elements that are unique to each version. Use color and do more than stick figures.
